CLASS OF 2011

Of the 525 graduates in the class of 2011, over sixty-six percent met the established requirements for admission to the UC or CSU. Ninety-eight percent planned to attend a four-year college or two-year college. Students from the class of 2011 attend institutions of higher learning across the United States and the world.

- 17% attend the University of California
- 14% attend the California State University
- 15% attend a private university
- 9% attend an out-of-state public university
- 43% attend a community college or technical school

Woodbridge graduates of 2011 attend all branches of the UC and CSU, Stanford University, University of Washington, Cornell University, Penn State University, Boston University, the University of Colorado, University of Nevada, Princeton, University of Arizona, Harvard College, Chapman University, Northwestern, Northeastern, Westmont College, University of Southern California, New York University, and Pepperdine University, to name but a few.

The ethnic diversity of our campus is a source of pride, with our student body comprised of 49% Caucasian, 31% Asian, 11% Hispanic, 3% African-American, and 2% Filipino. Our students hail from most states of our nation and/or countries of the world.

CURRICULUM

Woodbridge High School provides a comprehensive curriculum. Honors courses are offered in English, Social Science, Foreign Languages, and Natural Science. Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, Science, Social Science, Foreign Language, Fine Art, and Mathematics. Courses offered for the 2011 – 2012 school year.

SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT, AWARDS AND HONORS

Students at Woodbridge are encouraged to engage the world beyond the classroom. Recent achievements include:

- Latin students placed second in the Junior Classical League statewide convention and have consistently placed in the top three during the last fifteen plus years. Students have won top honors during the National Latin Convention held each summer.
- Robotics Team, Science Olympiad Team, Science Bowl Team, and the Science Oceans Bowl Team all earned top awards at state competitions.
- The Color Guard was a gold medalist at the state championships.
- Percussion Ensemble won the state championship. Jazz II received top place at Jazz Festival.
- The Marching Band were winners of the Field Show National Cup 2010
- The WHS Cheerleading Competition Squad is nationally ranked.
- Art students participate annually in an art competition that pays tribute to our service men and woman and their families. The winning art work is in the permanent collection at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Long Beach, CA.
- The school AP exam pass rate for 2011 was 84%

The Musical theater programs are well known and received awards for performers, orchestra, and the renowned "Spirit of the MACY" Award. Individual students are regularly recognized for superior academic performance through programs such as Bank of America Awards, National Merit Scholarships, and academic competitions. Each year the Woodbridge Staff proudly recognizes outstanding students and artists with our greatest recognition, the Sentinel Award. A strong English Language Development program with sheltered instruction in academic areas is provided.

The Technical Education Department offers courses from introductory level through advanced level in Automotive Technology, Business Technology, Screen Printing, and Photography. Automotive students continually earn places as the top finalist in the Orange County Dealerships Association competition. Automotive Technology students compete in NHRA and AAA/Ford competitions annually. Graphics students have earned top places in the graphic industry (RAISE Foundation) student competition.

GRADING SYSTEM

The marking system is based on a 4.0 scale for the grade of A. Plus or minus marks are not computed. Honors courses in grades eleven and twelve, and all Advanced Placement courses receive one extra grade point when the grade earned is a C or above. Class rank is not computed.
